# OPT AND CPT APPLICATIONS

The DGE is currently accepting OPT applications for Fall 2021 graduates and CPT applications for the Spring 2022 semester.





#### APPLYING FOR OPT AND CPT



Optical Practical Training (OPT) and Curricular Practical Training (CPT) hold great opportunities for our international students. If you are graduating for Fall 2021, the earliest day USCIS will accept an application for OPT is **September 18th** and the latest day USCIS will accept an OPT application is **February 15th**, **2022**. The application process can be lengthy, so it is important to apply early! Click <a href="here">here</a> for information on the OPT application process. CPT applications for the Spring 2022 semester will be accepted through **January 19**, **2022**. Our staff meets with students virtually to discuss work authorization. Click <a href="here">here</a> and select 'Work Authorization' to make an appointment.

## TRAVEL AUTHORIZATIONS

The Division of Global Engagement is still discouraging F-1 students and J-1 students and scholars from traveling outside of the U.S. during the University's winter break due to changing immigration regulations and safety concerns regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. Students who wish to renew their visas should visit the <u>U.S. Department of State's website</u> to determine visa wait times. Additionally, many airlines around the world are canceling flights to help combat the transmission of COVID-19. Please note that DGE staff cannot guarantee your return to the U.S. All students who decide to travel should be fully vaccinated and be prepared to present a negative COVID test (1-3 days) prior to reentering the U.S. For more information, please click <u>here</u>. To request a travel authorization, click <u>here</u>. Before submitting, make sure to register for SP22 classes.

If you do decide to travel and are unable to reenter the U.S. in January 2022, you can:

- lose your assistantship (Graduate students cannot hold assistantships while they are outside the U.S.)
- lose scholarships and/or on-campus employment
- be unable to complete your degree program (not all classes are offered remotely)
- lose a semester of eligibility for OPT and/or CPT
- owe rent that you may be legally bound to pay even if you are abroad
- be required to reapply for admission Students who skip a major term (Spring or Fall) are required to apply for readmission

How did you get into playing the fiddle?


I got into playing it because my father is a singer and my mum works for artists so I was born surrounded by Breton traditional music.

# STUDY ABROAD 2022

The Study Abroad Office is thrilled to announce its two new faculty-led programs in Tokyo, Japan and Rabat, Morocco. This is in addition to the long-standing programs in Costa Rica, England, France and Italy. Applications for Summer 2022 faculty-led programs are now open. Instructions on how to apply and how to make the \$500 deposit are located on the UL Study Abroad Program Moodle Site and website. The deposit does go toward the cost of your program, and the initial deadline is December 15th. A \$100 late fee will be charged for applications after this time.

With COVID-19 still being a concern, the University will follow the guidance of the State of Louisiana and the CDC regarding international travel. #### INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION WEEK




