RESOURCES

Career Closet - Located in Room 104 of Agnes Edwards Hall, the Career Closet provides students with free, gently used professional clothing items for interviews and career fairs. The Writing Center- Located in Room 108 of Griffin Hall, the Writing Center helps students improve on their writing skills.
